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Hotel Sol Principe ★★★★★

The recently refurbished Hotel Sol Principe enjoys a wonderful beachfront location overlooking Playamar Beach in Torremolinos. We are offering the hotel on two different board plans, both of which offer exceptional value for money: half board with wine, and all-inclusive. The hotel's stand-out main feature is its vast 1500m² lagoon-style outdoor pool, surrounded by sun lounging areas benefitting most attractively from the shade of tall mature palm trees. Other noteworthy features of the hotel are its highly spacious public areas, its sea view buffet restaurant terrace, enabling meals to be taken 'al fresco', its entertainments bar, and its heated indoor pool. A good selection of bars, restaurants and shops are located within a few minutes stroll of the hotel, which also enjoys direct access out onto the seafront promenade.

Rooms: 799 bedrooms with bath/shower and a balcony. All rooms also have telephone, central heating/air conditioning (June to September), satellite TV, mini-fridge, hair dryer and safe (at an extra charge).

Other Features: Buffet restaurant with some outdoor seating, a spacious entertainments bar, a sports bar, a vast lagoon pool, an adults only pool, a heated indoor pool, extensive palm-strewn sun lounging areas, a large lobby lounge area, a shopping arcade, wellness, beauty, and hairdressing services, occasional evening entertainment.

Torremolinos

Prior to the advent of mid twentieth century tourism Torremolinos was a fairly typical, yet unremarkable, small coastal fishing community that had dabbled in milling since Moorish times (a feel for this Torremolinos 'of yore' can still be had when walking around the fisherman's suburb of La Carihuela). Its one stand-out feature was the defensive lookout tower that the Moors had also built in order to be able to defend their mills. Unsurprisingly, the area became known as Tower Mills, or Torremolinos in Spanish.

Everything was to change for Torremolinos however in the 1960s, when the package tourism industry developed it as the first significant resort on the Costa del Sol. On that platform a burgeoning entertainments industry was born, supplying thrills and delights to an extremely wide variety of tastes.

Mindful as to what has attracted tourism to the area for decades, Torremolinos has taken particularly good care of its beaches, manicuring them daily for its sun-seeking guests, and providing them with ready and attractive access via a seven kilometre long seafront promenade.

The Costa Del Sol

The Costa del Sol is defined first and foremost by its climate, boasting an average of 320 cloud-free days a year, warm and luminously bright, yet rarely overly hot, due to the pleasantly tempering effects of the Mediterranean and its mountain backdrop.

It has also been blessed by history, being the area of Spain where the colourful artistic influence of the magnificent European Moorish empire of the middle ages is most consistently felt in terms of its architectural heritage and flamboyant flamenco culture. A laissez-faire friendliness and quasi-Arabian culture of warm hospitality have also contributed to the region's appeal, as has its highly developed tourism infrastructure.

Magical Mijas:

Mijas, a 'Pueblo Blanco' (white hill town), oozes Spanish authenticity, offering streetfulls of traditional architecture, a beautiful begardened parish church, and the remnants of a castle that once held invaders at bay. It retains an active donkey taxi community. When your legs begin to tire choose from a vast array of attractive restaurants and bars offering splendid views over the surrounding countryside.

Millionaire's Marbella:

The elegant resort of Marbella is renowned as the playground for the rich and famous. The beautiful Sierra Blanca Mountains provide a wonderful backdrop and create a lovely natural setting for this luxurious resort. The historic part of town, sits on a beautiful bay, sheltering lovely corners of a typically Andalusian flavour, with whitewashed houses and orange trees adorning the streets and squares.

Moorish Málaga:

Moorish Málaga is a delightful city in which to explore, shop, and relax and its picturesque fortifications remain one of its most identifiable features. Our visit here begins with the Moorish Alcázar, an enchantingly landscaped palace-cum-fortress, featuring formal gardens and Moorish water features. Next we visit the interior of Málaga's highly impressive Renaissance cathedral prior to time at leisure for private explorations.
